
1st Vice District Governor Ron Ballard

Saving Sight Council of Governor's Report – July 2022

- This fiscal year through March 31, 2022, Saving Sight's eye banking operations have provided sight-saving tissues for transplant to 2,719 individuals in our service area of Missouri, Kansas, Illinois and beyond. Saving sight's work in processing autologous serum eye drops continues to impact those in the U.S. as well. As of March 31, 2022, FYTD Saving Sight had processed 11,048 orders for Vital Tears, which continues to grow at a rapid pace.
- •The board and its Charitable Grants Committee has approved grants to three nonprofit organizations that share a similar purpose to Saving Sight's mission. Grants include \$35,000 to KidSight, \$15,000 to District M-& Lions Eyeglass Recycling Program, and \$10,000 to Mid-South Lions sight and Hearing Service. Congratulations to these three organizations. We are proud to support your good work that is connected to Saving Sight's work.
- At its June 2022 meeting Saving Sight said farewell to four board members: IPCC Bob Noellsch, PDG Devin Struttmann, Lion Mike Oldelehr (M-7), and Lion Pat Martchink (M-2). We appreciate your time, expertise, and passion for our mission to save sight! At the same time, Saving Sight welcomed four new board members: CC Phyllis Krebs, VCC Jennie Mosher, Lion Patrick Mills (M-7), and PCC George Winkeler (M-2).
